

Kettering College

Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA) and American Rescue Plan Act, 2021(ARP) Reporting for the period ending December 31, 2021 as of 1/9/2022. This is a final report as all funds have been disbursed.

(1) Kettering College has signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

(2) Kettering College has received \$262,647 under the CRRSAA and \$764,725 under the ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

(3) Kettering College has distributed a total amount of \$262,547 under the CRRSAA and \$764,725 under the ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs as of 12/31/2021.

(4) The College estimated 734 students at the institution are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA, and 753 students are eligible under ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

(5) The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant under the CRRSAA is 734 students and 744 students under ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

(6) The following describes how the institution determined who received emergency financial aid grants and how much under the following programs:

The method used to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants under CRRSAA is as follows: We used the Estimated family contribution calculated by the Department of Education and allowed the student to appeal if they had a household unemployment that has impacted the student's financial situation. The breakdown is as follows:

- With an Estimated Family Contributions (EFC) of \$0-\$5,711 they would receive a grant award of \$500 each
- With an EFC of \$5,712-\$20,000 they would receive a grant award of \$400 each
- With no EFC record on file or an EFC of greater than \$20,000 they would receive a grant award of \$200 each
- If you have had an unemployment in your immediate household in the last 6 months and are receiving a grant of \$200 please submit proof of that to kim.rawlins@kc.edu . The committee has authorized an additional \$200 in that situation.

The method used to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants under ARP is as follows: We used the Estimated Family Contribution calculated by the Department of Education and allowed the student to appeal if they had a household unemployment that has impacted the student's financial situation.

- With an Estimated Family Contributions (EFC) of \$0-\$5,711 they would receive a grant award of \$1,525 each
- With an EFC of \$5,712-\$20,000 they would receive a grant award of \$1,200 each
- With no EFC record on file or an EFC of greater than \$20,000 they would receive a grant award of \$600 each

If you have had an unemployment in your immediate household in the last 6 months and are receiving a grant of \$600 please submit proof of that to kim.rawlins@kc.edu . The committee has authorized an additional \$600 in that situation. The deadline for the above change request is 7/16/2021.

(7) The instructions that the college provided to students for the CRRSAA program are as follows: This was emailed on 2/19/2021 to all students enrolled in the winter 2021 semester.

“Dear Kettering College Student

Kettering College has been awarded \$262,647 under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021(CRRSAA) to make financial aid grants to students. Some of the language in the guidance of this grant is that we must prioritize grants to students with exceptional need, such as students who receive Pell Grants. There are some limitations on who can receive these grants and that is those students enrolled in certificate or degree seeking programs. In addition the grants must be made to U.S. citizens or federal financial aid eligible non-U.S. citizens. Here is a [link](#) that explains federal financial aid eligible non-U.S. citizens.

The colleges CRRSAA grant committee met on Monday February 15, 2021 and decided that based on the grant requirements, with and effort to maximize the number of students receiving grants, that the allocation of the funds would be as such

To Those eligible:

With an Estimated Family Contributions(EFC) of \$0-\$5,711 they would receive a grant award of \$500 each

With an EFC of \$5,712-\$20,000 they would receive a grant award of \$400 each

With no EFC record on file or an EFC of greater than \$20,000 they would receive a grant award of \$200 each

This grant may be used for any component of the student's cost of attendance or for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus, such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care) or child care. Under this methodology the committee is awarding grants to 735 of our 793 students for a total of \$275,100

If you have had an unemployment in your immediate household in the last 6 months and are receiving a grant of \$200 please submit proof of that to kim.rawlins@kc.edu the committee has authorized an additional \$200 in that situation.

The deadline for the above change request is 3/12/2021

These grants will be applied to your student account by 3/5/21 and then disbursed by check to you. If you would like these to stay as a credit to your student account please fill out the attached authorization form and send it to kim.rawlins@kc.edu by 2/26/2021. The authorization form is not required to be awarded this grant.

The committee put in place a second possibility for grants for those with extenuating circumstances that create exceptional need not considered in the allocations above. Please reach out to ben.hotelling@kc.edu before 4/30/2021 for an application if you believe that your situation is not considered above.

To Those eligible:

With an Estimated Family Contributions(EFC) of \$0-\$5,711 they would receive a grant award of \$1,525.00 each

With an EFC of \$5,712-\$20,000 they would receive a grant award of \$1,200 each

With no EFC record on file or an EFC of greater than \$20,000 they would receive a grant award of \$600 each

This award does exclude permission to attend class students that have not been admitted to a degree or certificate program here at Kettering College for the Fall 2021 semester.

This grant may be used for any component of the student's cost of attendance or for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus, such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care) or child care. Under this methodology the committee is awarding grants to 672 of 731 students for a total of \$764,725.00
