Last summer almost 400 properties were nominated for this award. VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Summer will be here before we know it! Our Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Department offers a variety of exciting and engaging camps every summer. If you are an adult or are a student age 16 or older, and enjoy working with children, you may be the perfect camp volunteer to assist our staff. Volunteering with summer camps can help you gain job experience, fulfill service hours, or simply enjoy helping while having fun!

If you enjoy meeting people and working outdoors, why not consider joining our dedicated team of volunteers at Frazee Pavilion this summer? Volunteers are asked to work 6-8 hours and must be able to stand 2-3 hours. Volunteers help welcome and direct guests, and help with bag check. There will be a mandatory orientation in May, date to be announced.

Kettering Leadership Academy

The Kettering Leadership Academy (KLA) is currently accepting applications for the 2023 - 2024 class. KLA is designed for people looking to take on leadership roles within our community, such as serving on a board or commission at the City of Kettering, or serving at one of our area non-profit organizations. Applicants are required to live or work in Kettering.

The Academy begins in September with a mandatory overnight retreat at Camp Joy. Sessions are held once a month throughout the year until graduation in May. Topics include Kettering history, local government, community organizations, education, healthcare, business, service clubs, and volunteering. The fee for the Academy is \$700.
